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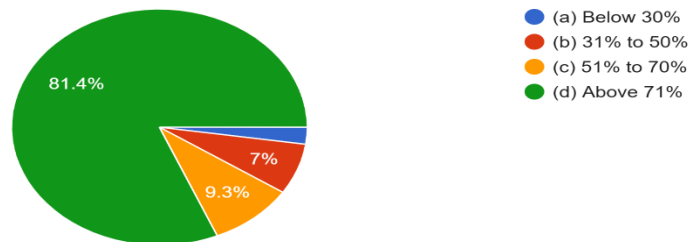

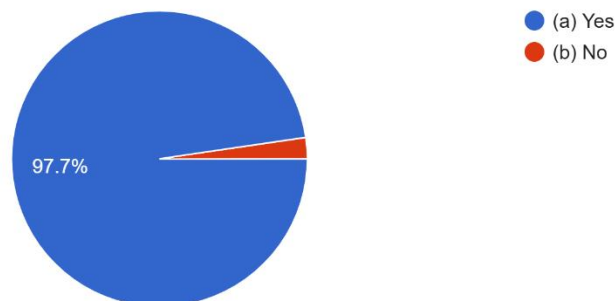
Q1. Do you think that the College administration gives you the right information about admissions, exams and scholarships?.

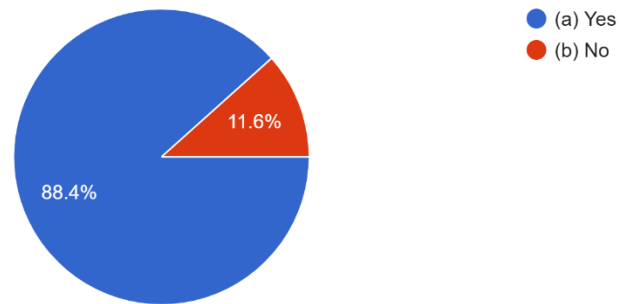
Q2. Do you get study/reading material through your whatsapp groups?

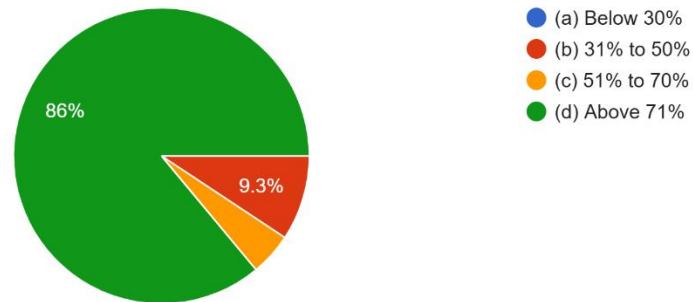
Q3 Do you receive your class information or class links before the class starts?

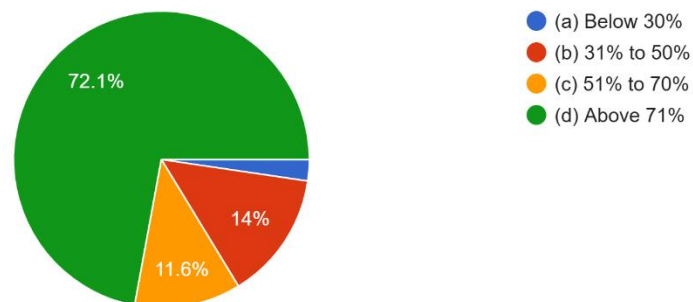
Q4. Does your college encourage you to participate in sports and cultural activities

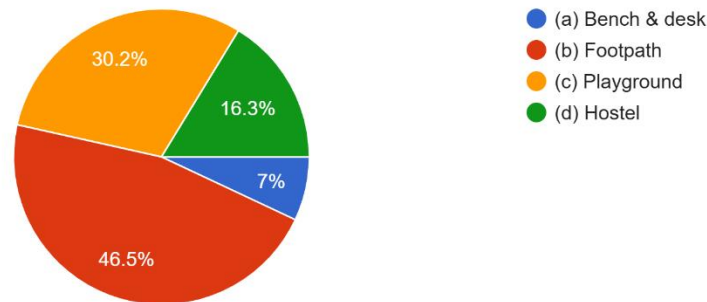
Q5. Is the college administration willing to listen to your complaints?

According to the responses collected, 81.4% of students believe they can receive timely information regarding admissions, examinations, and scholarships. Furthermore, an impressive 97.7% of students feel that they can access study materials through WhatsApp groups maintained by the College. Additionally, 88.4% of students report that they receive information related to their classes. Moreover, 86% of students feel encouraged to participate in sports and cultural activities.

The administration is viewed as being interested in student feedback, as evidenced by 72.1% of students reporting that they feel acknowledged. However, students have identified areas for improvement within the College, specifically in the following sectors: footpaths (46.5%), playgrounds (30.2%), hostels (16.3%) and benches and desks (7%).

A total of 19 teachers provided their responses to the survey and their names are listed below.

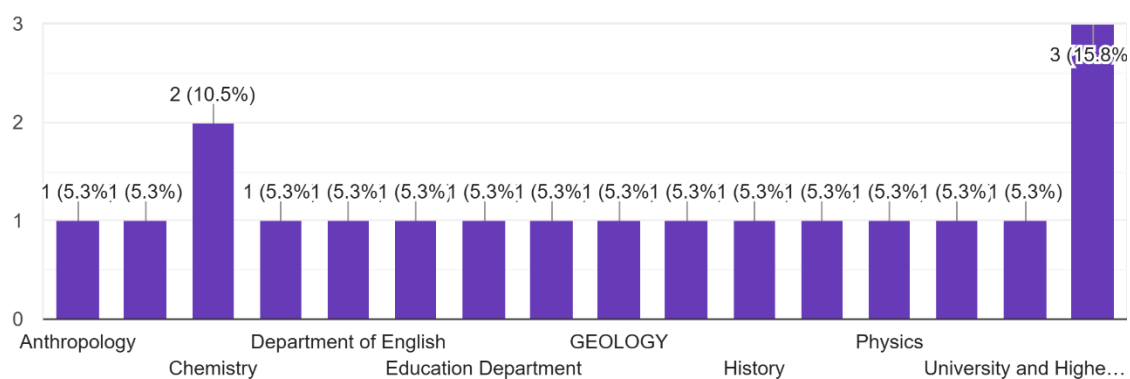

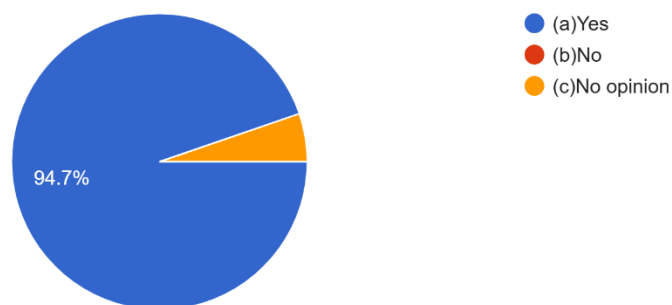
Q1. In your opinion, does the College administration demonstrate support for the well-being of its teachers?

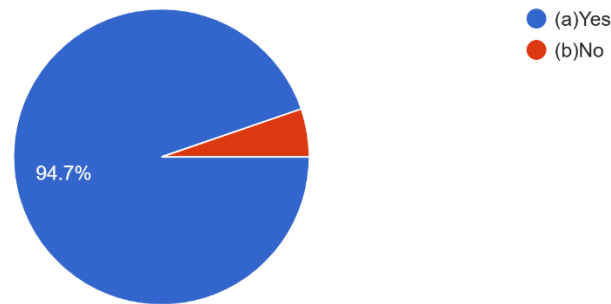
Q2. Is your Head of the College submitting your ACR(Annual Confidential Report) or GPF punctually/regularly /whenever necessary.

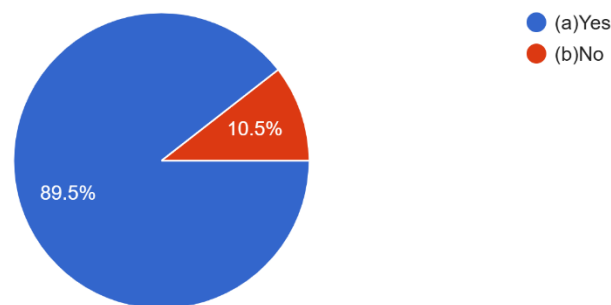
Q3. Do you obtain details regarding the precise announcement of the commencement of classes?

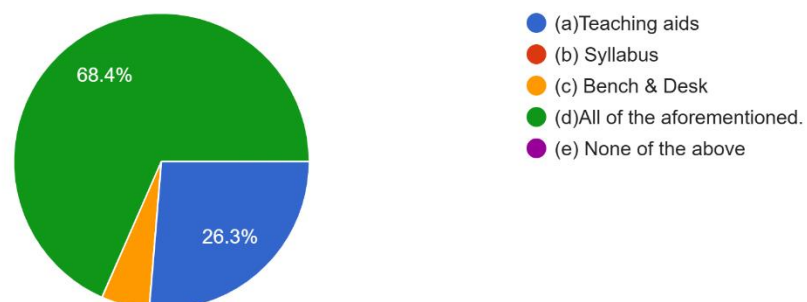
Q4. Is the College administration conducting discussions regarding program and course outcomes for students on an annual basis?




In this survey, all participating teachers (100%) expressed the belief that the College is committed to the welfare of its faculty. Furthermore, 94.7% of the teachers indicated that the head of the College consistently submits Annual Confidential Reports (ACR), GPF applications and other relevant

documents. Additionally, 94.7% of the teachers confirmed that they receive formal announcements regarding class schedules each session.


The findings from question four reveal that 89.5% of the teachers were present during discussions concerning the Programme and Course outcomes for students.
